Senses – Humans have five senses – smell, touch, taste, sight and hearing

Mammal – An animal that has a backbone and is warm blooded. They drink their mothers milk. Humans are mammals

Bird – Animals that have a backbone, feathers, beaks and wings. They also lay eggs

Reptile – A cold blooded animal and usually has skin covered in scales

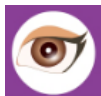
Carnivore – An animal that likes to eat meat

Herbivore – An animal that likes to eat plants and vegetables

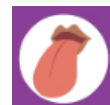
Omnivore – An animal that likes to eat plants and meat (other animals)

Sense of Sight



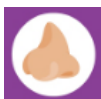
