



## Holy Family Halewood Year 5/6 Spanish Spooky House and My Town



In this sequence of lessons we will use our language skills to:

- Revisit grammar about nouns including masculine and feminine genders.
- Revisit and practise use and position of adjectives with nouns Spanish.
- Explore cultural similarities and differences in Spanish homes and homes in own country.
- Read a cartoon picture story about a haunted house and understand the main points and investigate unfamiliar language in context.
- Write own short descriptions and sentences using a reference resource including a bilingual dictionary.
- Play games in listening and speaking to practise accurate listening and pronunciation

### Learning Objectives

To broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced by recognising and using nouns accurately for rooms in the house

To appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language by following a story about a haunted house and writing my own interesting spooky house sentences.

To write phrases adapt these to create new sentences using nouns and colour adjectives to describe rooms in a house.

To understand basic grammar to build sentences using nouns and adjectives to describe a house.

To recognise and understand some nouns of places I might visit in town.

To understand basic grammar including the difference between masculine and feminine nouns.

To speak in sentences to explain what places you might see in a town.
