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


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Aspire Programme

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Homework

Your child will receive a reading record alongside a homework book. Reading records need to be in daily and children are expected to read every night. This can be a Reading Plus lesson or a book of their choice (a couple of pages). If children do not hand in their reading record (signed by a parent), then they will read for five minutes at the beginning of their lunch break.

As part of the nightly reading, at least two lessons of Reading Plus must be completed at home so that children can achieve the target of 5 lessons per week. Opportunities are given to children to catch up through the week however any outstanding lessons will be completed at Friday lunchtime.

Each week, your child will be given spellings in their homework books and a task to complete. Tests will be carried out on Mondays. Books should only be returned on a Monday so that the homework can be marked and children have as much time as possible to practice for their weekly tests.

Children will remain in these 'Houses' throughout their time at Holy Family. Children are awarded Dojos throughout the week to celebrate their successes. The child with the most dojos in each class is awarded the 'Class Dojo' certificate.



- Times Table Test (Year 4 Children)
- The Year 4 Times Tables Test, known by the government and schools as the Year 4 <u>Multiplication Tables Check</u>, is an annual test to check that Year 4s in England and Wales have a good level of times tables knowledge.
- Who will take the Multiplication Tables Check?

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a times tables test to be taken online by children at the end of year 4. There will be a three-week window in June for pupils to complete an online form, which will take about 5 minutes per child.

What will be tested in the Multiplication Tables Check?

The check will only assess multiplication facts and not the corresponding division facts. It will test up to 12×12 . The 1 times table is not included (apart from in practice questions). There will be a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables.

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How many questions are included in the Multiplication Tables Check?

The Multiplication Tables Check has 25 questions and 3 practice questions.

How long is the Multiplication Tables Check?

Children will have 6 seconds to answer a question with a 3 second gap between questions. The whole test will take less than 5 minutes.

Will there be a pass mark?

There is to be no threshold or pass mark and individual school results will not be published in performance tables!

Children in Year 2 focus on 2, 5 and 10 times tables

Children in Year 3 focus on 3, 4 and 8 times tables

Children by the end of Year 4 must know all their times tables up to and including 12 x 12.
