

Read, Write, Inc Phonics

All children take part in a daily phonics programme to teach them to read using phonics (letter sounds). Children quickly learn to blend letter sounds together following an active and effective programme.

Lessons focus on at least one new sound a day. They will *Hear it and say it, Read it, Practise speed sounds, Write it , Speed write.* Read Write Inc is a fundamental part of your child learning how to read in the first instance.

If you feel you need support with letter sounds or require further information please speak to a Reception teacher who will be happy to help.











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Reading

Children will be given a Read Write Inc book bag which links to the sounds your child will be learning that week in school.

All children have also been given mnemonic Read Write Inc sound sheets with all Speed Sounds Set 1, 2 & 3 on for your child to be recognising daily at home.

Reading will take place within Read Write Inc lessons and your child will also receive one to one reading throughout the week.

Your child has a reading record where comments will be made about your child's progress. **Please comment in your child's reading record when you listen to your child read.**



PLEASE encourage your child to share / read their book with you ideally each night and write in their reading record.



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Reading Books

Our reading books are well ranged to suit all learners.

Read Write Inc' Children will be given a Read Write Inc book bag book which links to the sounds your child will be learning that week in school Your child should be able to access these books independently.

'*Rising Star' books* Children will be given an additional book to support further reading of common exception words and comprehension. This book will need to be read with an adult.

'Family Book' focus on key vocabulary and story content read by parents to the child.

All categories of books will be issued to your child during the year to create a healthy balance.

Please make 'Read Write Inc' books your priority when reading with your child at home.



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Spellings

Children will be given new spellings each half term to learn. Spellings are differentiated depending on ability and link directly to the sounds children are learning in their Phonics lessons.

Please support your child to learn their 5 spellings each week (Year 1) 10 spelling Year 2- the date of each weekly spelling quiz is located above each list.

Children can use their homework book to practise writing the words.

Do not worry if your child is struggling at this point in the year. They are also practising spellings in their daily Phonics lesson and will gradually become more confident with the process. Perhaps focus on 2 or 3 spellings to begin with until they gain more confidence.

Phonics

The Phonics Screening Check is designed to allow schools to assess whether children have made expected progress within their phonics learning and have reached an appropriate standard. It can help teachers to identify gaps in children's phonics knowledge and gives the school a picture of where children may be excelling or requiring extra support.

There will be a Year 1 Phonics Screening Meeting later in the Year to explain more information.



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Year 2 SATS

Year 2 SATS will take place in May, 2023.



Year 2 SATS

The SATs tests are taken at the end of key stage 1 by pupils in year 2, who are six or seven years old. The tests help teachers to measure pupils' performance, progress and attainment to assess any needs they have as they move into key stage 2.

The tests an be taken at any point during May. We will arrange the tests in such a way that they are unaware that they are taking them.



Year 2 SATS

How the tests are marked:

After the tests are taken, they are marked internally in school. A teacher judgement will be made about the level your child is working at.

At the end of summer term, you will receive your child's school report that includes the teacher assessment judgments.








Maths Paper 1: Arithmetic
