# **Background**

At Holy Family Catholic Primary School, it is our intention that we develop our children fully; academically, spiritually, physically, emotionally, and mentally. We achieve this goal through a variety of means. The Aspire Team Programme, which is a vehicle to study significant international figures that have displayed Gospel values has been part of our whole package of personal development, for a number of years. However, we felt the programme needed freshening up and now links the key Gospel values with British Values. The children will now study a wider net of roles and people, who are all British.

#### Intent

At Holy Family, Christ is at our centre and so the Gospel values are at the root of everything we do. The Gospel values are taken from the Beatitudes; the values Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount. (Matthew 5). Therefore these core values that that Christians are inspired to live by, form the core values of our school and this programme.

Furthermore, it is our intent, that the study of British Values is both meaningful and inspiring. Therefore, we have combined the study of British values with the Aspire programme. Each Gospel value has been directly linked to a British Value. Children will study key roles, responsibilities and people who have lived out their lives according to these values.

It is our vision that each child fulfils their potential, regardless of their background or circumstances. Therefore, we feel it imperative that we inspire them with others who have fulfilled their own potential regardless of background and circumstances. Our Curriculum aims to provide opportunities for our children to build independence, resilience and perseverance, the chance to be themselves and celebrate their individuality and thoughtful ways to show care and compassion. So this curriculum enhancement, is a perfect vehicle to explore how others have done exactly this – people to aspire to. We can explore together; *How have others risen to the challenge?* 

# **Implementation**

Each Key Phase will focus on different people and roles. The programme is broken down into the three terms, so that the children can study a wide of people and jobs across the year. Each term will be a new study.

#### **EYFS**

As a Catholic school, whose foundations are based on Jesus, the first people who we are called to be inspired by is the Holy Family. Therefore, in EYFS, the children will study Jesus, Mary and Joseph; the Holy Family. The order in which they are studied will reflect the Liturgical Calendar.

# **Key Stage One**

A successful society is built on people who are compassionate and caring. At its core, it should recognise and uphold basic human rights and understand that its members all have key roles and responsibilities too. In Britain, there are a wide range of key roles and responsibilities. Children will explore these, which are linked to the core Gospel and British Values. These values are highlighted by a key piece of Scripture.

As demonstrated, in the table, each class will explore a range of occupations ranging from key worker jobs to sport, to those in the creative arts. Each job will be represented by a British person in that field – they will become the 'poster person'. However, as the children are younger, they will not explore the life of that person but the role they hold. To help with this, they will use a key resource; the Ceebeebies programme 'Let's Play', which explores the each job, through an age and stage appropriate way.

## **Key Stage Two**

Once children move into Key Stage Two, the programme moves on again. Our pupils will study not only the roles but individuals who have been exemplary in that role too. We want to galvanise our pupils to view Britain as a wonderful and eclectic mix of inspirational people, both from the past and in the present. Each person studied, has all made a positive contribution to society, the country and in some cases, the wider world in their own way or own fields.

Just like in Key Stage One, Key Stage Two will study British different people in each term. Some of the people studied have quite challenging stories and raise difficult questions. The more challenging the story, the higher age group. In other words, the older children will study the more challenging stories and topics. As is core to the programme, the people who the children will study have led lives that demonstrate Gospel Values and linked British Values.

Each class will be given a Latin Team Name. The Latin name is taken from the values themselves e.g *Team Veritas* when translated to English is *Team Truth*. The language of Latin is rooted in our Catholic Heritage. It also gives the teams a fun but strong name that is memorable name as it is unique to anything else in school.

Each term is broken down into three key categories; sport, campaigners and 'other'. Therefore, each team will study a different person each term linked to one of the category. Key figures in the 'other' category are those who have followed their own individual passions and interests and become influential in or significant to that field.
