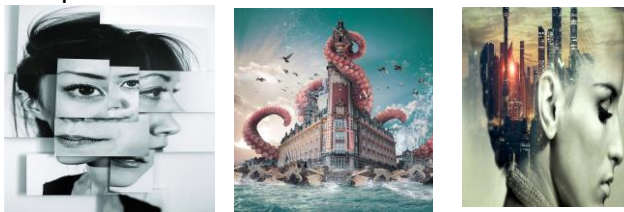


Learning Objectives:

- To replicate the mood and expression of a painting through photography

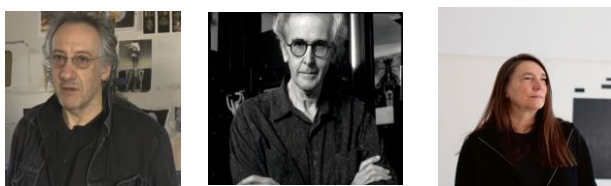
Key facts and knowledge I will acquire:

Photomontage is a type of collage in which photographs are placed into a single composition.



Dada was an art movement that formed in Switzerland during the First World War, in reaction to what was going on during the war time.

Contrast: To demonstrate the obvious difference between two things.

Crop (verb): To cut something down to size.
