ASPIRE DAY ONE

This week, all children across the school have taken part in our first Aspire Day of the year. This is our bespoke school programme in which we study British people who can aspire to.

In EYFS and Key Stage One, the children will study the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph who, as a Catholic community, are the first people we look to aspire to. For this term, their focal person will be Joseph the father of Jesus.

In Key Stage One, they will study a variety of jobs that are crucial to a successful society, including key worker jobs, roles that keep justice and the creative arts.

In Key Stage Two, each class will begin the year by studying an inspirational sports person. Between the classes, they will study; Baroness Tanni Grey-Thompson, Kevin Sinfield, Donald Campbell, Steve Prescott, and Marcus Rashford.

The work always creates great discussion and debate. Why not ask your children all about what they have been learning? This event takes place next Friday 15th September 2023. With this in mind, we have decided to have an election in our school community and explain to our children about one of our British Values -

Democracy.

We are inviting all children, teachers, parents and family members to take part in a vote next Friday before (8:30am till 9am)

and after (3:15pm till 3:30pm) school. Everyone has a choice to vote for a special day to take place in school this year. You will collect a polling card, go to the booth and vote and place in the ballot

box.

OUTSIDE PROVIDERS

As a school, we pay for specialist outside providers for a variety of curriculum lessons. We bring in a specialist P.E. provider, Mr Halpin, to take all classes for one of their weekly P.E. lessons. We also bring in a Modern Foreign Language specialist, Mrs Langley, who provides Spanish lessons for our KS2 children once a week. We buy in a music specialist, Mrs Cooke, from Knowsley Borough Council's Performing Arts Department who teaches our Y6 and Y5 pupils to play musical instruments. This year Yr 6 will be learning to play the flute and Yr 5 will learn the ukulele.

CHILDREN'S BIRTHDAYS

As always, we will be giving the opportunity for children to wear their own clothes on their birthday. We feel that this is a chance for us to celebrate each individual child. As a way of building self-esteem; the children would have the opportunity to feel unique from all other children in a positive manner. No theme, no payment just a privilege as it's their individual special day. Obviously, we know some children's birthdays will fall on weekends. Should this be the case, they may choose to wear their own clothes on the Friday before or the Monday after. Again, if their birthday falls during school holiday, they may choose to have their special day on the last day of the given term or the first day back. We felt it was important to give them a choice as again this privilege is a personal one. If your child had a birthday this week and didn't realise, they could wear their own clothes; they can come into school this Monday wearing non uniform.

MEET THE CLASS TEACHING TEAM

The first of our 'meet the class teaching team' meetings will take place from Monday 18th September onwards. This will be an opportunity for you to meet your child's class teacher and teaching assistant, have a look at the classroom, listen to updates for the class and ask any further questions if needed.

It would be great if every child could have a representative from their family, if at all possible. Don't worry if you can't as we will send the information home to any working parents who are struggling to get time off.

The first part of the meeting will be the MacMillan's Biggest Coffee Morning at 8:45am - 9:15am in the hall. Tea/Coffee/Juice/croissants/brioche will be available. Parents can donate money for MacMillan's Biggest Coffee Morning. The next part of the meeting will be 'Meet the staff' presentation at 9:15am to 9:45am in your child's classroom. If any child in Year 2 to Year 6 would like to be considered as a School Councillor this year, they are welcome to apply as of next week. The children are asked to represent their friends and bring new ideas and initiatives that benefit the whole school. Please note that the School Council meetings will

take place every fortnight on a Thursday at 8:30am in Mrs Reeves room. The first meeting will

be Thursday 21st September at 8:30am. Those children who are interested in the role have been asked to complete a poster with reasons of why they should be the school Councillors and any ideas that they would like to bring. These children will present this to their class next week. Elections will take place next Friday 15th September during
