Key Vocabulary:


Grid References a grid reference allows someone to mark a place on a map by referring to vertical and horizontal lines called 'eastings' and 'northings'. The further East the 'eastings' are, the higher the number - the same applies for 'northings'.

Key: Maps often use symbols or colours to represent things, and the map key explains what they mean.

Ordnance Survey: national mapping agency for Great Britain.

Route: a way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination

Scale: The scale of a map is the ratio of a distance on the map to the corresponding distance on the ground.
