Key Words

STEM – An acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths

Stereotype - A stereotype is an assumption about what someone will be like (e.g. their personal qualities or attributes) based on a group they belong to.

Achieve – to complete something successfully

Goal – when a person sets an aim or a target for them to complete

Growth mindset – when faced with a challenge or setback, a person is more determined to reach their goal.

Ambition – a strong desire to become reach a goal or achieve a target.

Teamwork – working with others in a group to complete a task successfully.
