Observe – Something you notice that you think is important



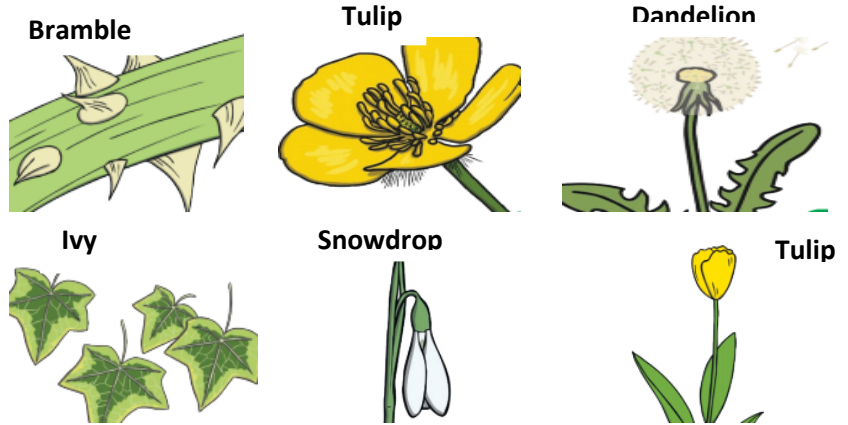

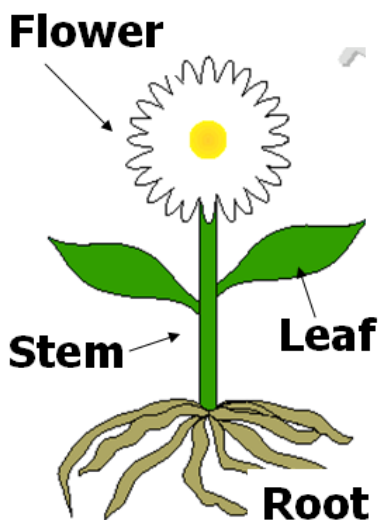
