Learning Objectives

To broaden vocabulary and develop ability to understand new words that are introduced by recognising and understanding some nouns for fruits and vegetables in Spanish.

To explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.

To understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied by recognising and trying to use the correct Spanish word for "a" before the noun for fruits in Spanish.

To engage in conversations; ask and answer questions by asking politely for a piece of fruit or a vegetable.

To listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding through listening to and joining in with a story about a hungry giant's breakfast.

To appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language by playing a board game and recalling some of the fruit and vegetable nouns we have practised.
