Additional support:

There may be times when we feel that some children may need additional support. This could be children who are struggling with something in particular, or children who may be high achievers who we want to boost further.

This could be:

- Daily reading support
- Daily pre-planned interventions
- Ad-hoc support 1:1 or small groups



Multiplication Tables Check

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC), is an annual test, taken online, to check that Year 4 children in England and Wales have a good level of times tables knowledge.

Schools must administer the MTC within the 2-week period from Monday 3rd June 2024. Due to our half term, we will administer from **Monday 10th June – Friday 14th June**.

The check will only assess multiplication facts and not the corresponding division facts. It will test up to 12 × 12. There will be a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables.



The Multiplication Tables Check has 25 questions and 3 practice questions.

Children will have 6 seconds to answer a question with a 3 second gap between questions. The whole test will take less than 5 minutes.

There is no threshold or pass mark and individual school results will not be published in performance tables.



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

Reading records need to be in daily and children are expected to read most nights. This can be a Reading Plus lesson or a book of their choice.


If children do not hand in their reading record in regularly across the week, then they will read for five minutes at the beginning of their lunch break.


As part of home reading, at least two lessons of Reading Plus must be completed at home across the week so that children can achieve the target of 5 lessons per week.
