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Homework

Reading

Reading records need to be in daily and children are expected to read most nights. This can be a Reading Plus lesson or a book of their choice.

If children do not hand in their reading record in regularly across the week, then they will read for five minutes at the beginning of their lunch break.

As part of the nightly reading, at least two lessons of Reading Plus must be completed at home across the week so that children can achieve the target of 5 lessons per week.

Opportunities are given to access Reading Plus during the school day too.

Each week, on a Monday, your child will be given spellings in their homework books and a task to complete. This is usually based on our current English book.

Tests will be carried out the following Monday.
