### **Uniform Reminders**

#### **JEWELLERY:**

The only jewellery we allow in school is a wrist watch or stud ear-rings.

We ask you, for reasons of Health and Safety, not to allow your children to come into school wearing rings or necklaces.

#### PE KIT:

PE Kit to be in school each day as lessons may change day due to weather etc.

Children can bring black leggings/jogging pants to be worn in colder months for outside lessons only.

During P.E. lessons, children will be asked to remove ear-rings or cover them with a plaster.








### Year 6's Recommended Reads















### **Additional support:**

There may be times when we feel that some children may need additional support. This could be children who are struggling with something in particular, or children who may be high achievers who we want to boost further.

### This could be:

- Daily reading support
- Daily pre-planned interventions
- Ad-hoc support 1:1 or small groups



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### Homework

### Reading

Reading records need to be in daily and children are expected to read most nights. This can be a Reading Plus lesson or a book of their choice.


If children do not hand in their reading record in regularly across the week, then they will read for five minutes at the beginning of their lunch break.

As part of the nightly reading, at least two lessons of Reading Plus must be completed at home across the week so that children can achieve the target of 5 lessons per week.

Opportunities are given to access Reading Plus during the school day too.

If 5 Reading Plus lessons are not being achieved by the end of the week, children will be required to complete the lessons at the beginning of dinner time.







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### Homework

**Spelling** 

Each week, on a Monday, your child will be given spellings in their homework books and a task to complete. This is usually based on our current English book.

Tests will be carried out the following Monday.

Homework Books can remain at home until a Monday.

**Handwriting** 

To support children's handwriting we will provide children with a bubble writing sheet. An example of how the letters should look can be found at the top of the page. As part of the year 6 writing assessment criteria, writing can only be working at if it is formed correctly and joined.


