#### PTA UPDATE

Mr Quigley met with the School Council and Mrs Eccleston (a volunteer parent on the PTA). Mr Quigley highlighted the issue of coach transport to take children out on school trips currently and asked if the PTA could subsidise the cost of coaches to take the children to our Christmas pantomime. Each year, parents have expressed a desire to keep trips going but the costs are so high at times and so hard to subsidise.

We know how much enjoyment the children get when going on school trips too.

Unfortunately, the PTA funds are extremely low with only £500 in the bank. We were looking for £1500 to contribute to the cost so that we could subsidise the pantomime further for parents. Our recent PTA initiative of Crazy Hair day only made £120 when we should be looking at least £350 if every child brings a £1 in. In the past, we had a thriving PTA with lots of members here at Holy Family and we would have had lots of funds in the PTA account. This money was then spent on the children immediately.

The problem we continue to have is we have so few members who can only do so much. The problem we also have is parents not on the PTA will often suggest lots of great ideas such as a summer fair but then don't put themselves forward to launch this or help out and therefore the ideas stop.

We would love to have a summer fair but we need lots of people to jump on the PTA bandwagon and get this launched as it takes a lot of people, time and effort to do something like this. Other schools do it, so we can't we. We need people to put themselves forward, bring new ideas to the table, put the effort in to see these ideas through whilst also being mindful of not asking for too much money throughout the school year. It's a fine line as the cost of living continues to have an impact and you can't always please everyone!
