

HEALTHY FAMILIES COURSE

We have still a couple of spaces if you would like to come along to the family learning activity on Tuesday. See below poster for more information. It will start this Tuesday instead due to the snow delaying the event last week.

We have chosen to be part of an exciting behaviour-change initiative to encourage more children and their families to walk to school. WOW - the walk to school challenge is delivered by Living Streets, the UK charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible experience the benefits of walking to school.

The pupil-led challenge enables children to selfreport how they get to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. It's that simple! What are the benefits of walking to school?

- · Children feel happier and healthier
- They arrive to school refreshed and ready to learn
- Helps reduce congestion and pollution at the school gates

What if we can't walk to school?

Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badges. You can park or hop off public transport at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the remaining journey.



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
