



of God's creation.






















Collective Worship **Live** simply

Fairtrade Fortnight

We engaged in Fair Trade Fortnight with enthusiasm, starting with an assembly designed to raise awareness among our pupils. Our goal was to help the children understand why these principles matter and how they directly relate to our school's value of justice. Through these activities, we aimed to foster a deeper appreciation for fair trade practices and encourage our students to consider their role in promoting equity in the world around them.

Big School Clean Up

We liaised with Knowsley Council to collect rubbish in the local area to improve our local community. Inspired by Laudato Si' to be stewards of creation, Year 6 pupils took part, demonstrating their commitment to caring for the environment.

Children understood that small acts make a big difference to all in the community.

Big School Clean Up

After the activity, they discussed their experience and findings with younger children, sharing the types of litter they found and explaining the impact of waste on local wildlife and ecosystems. They emphasised the importance of keeping our surroundings clean and respecting the planet. As a result of these discussions, they proposed next steps, such as setting up regular litter-picking sessions and encouraging the whole school to reduce waste.



This initiative not only fostered a sense of environmental stewardship but also empowered younger students to take responsibility for their community, reinforcing the values of teamwork, respect, and sustainability.
