Adjective Bank with "I am"

Estoy - I am

feliz - happy

triste - sad

orgullos - proud

sorprendido - surprised

confundido - confused

cansado - tired

*Change the **o** for an **a** if you are a girl.*

Tengo hambre - I am hungry

Tengo sed - I am thirsty

Tengo calor - I feel hot

Tengo frío - I feel cold

Grammar Bank

In Spanish, we don't really use personal pronouns because the **ending of the verb** tells us "who" we are talking about:

Me llamo - My name is

Se llama - her/his name is

Tengo ... años - I am ... years old

Tiene ... años - she/he is ... years old

Vivo en - I live in

Vive en - she/he lives in

Soy de - I am from

Es de - she/he is from

Grammar Bank

To describe feelings in Spanish, we need to make sure that the adjective used matches the person. The spelling can **change for a male or a female person**. Watch out!

In Spanish, we do not always use "I am" (**estoy**) to explain how we are feeling, we also use "I have the hunger" (**tengo hambre**).
