Additional support:

There may be times when we feel that some children may need additional support. This could be children who are struggling with something in particular, or children who may be high achievers who we want to boost further.

This could be:

- Daily reading support (RWI Interventions)
- Daily pre-planned interventions
- Ad-hoc support 1:1 or small groups



Homework

We value our home/school partnership.

Please support your child to complete their homework tasks each week:

Reading books – changed every Monday (Book bags only in on a Monday please)

Spellings - Sent home every half term/ weekly quiz

Times Tables Rock Stars - X2, X5 & X10

We recognise children do lots of clubs outside of school, we don't send out lots of homework but this is the minimum expectation above.



Reading

Our reading books are well ranged to suit all learners.

'Read Write Inc' Children will be given a Read Write Inc book which links to the sounds your child will be learning that week in school. Your child should be able to access these books independently.

'Rising Star' books Children will be given an additional book to support further reading of common exception words and comprehension. This book will need to be read with an adult.

Your child has a reading record where comments will be made about your child's progress.

Please comment in your child's reading record when you listen to them read. Please send the reading record and books into school on a Monday so we can allocate your child two new books.

Please make 'Read Write Inc' books your priority when reading with your child at home.

Encourage your child to share / read their book with you ideally each night. Please re-read the books with your child as this will help to build their confidence with reading.



Spellings

Children will be given new spellings each half term to learn. Spellings are differentiated depending on ability and link directly to the sounds children are learning in their Phonics lessons.

Please support your child to learn their 5 spellings each week. The date of each weekly spelling quiz is located above each list.

We will send your child's spelling book home each Monday night (orange book) so you can see how well they have done in their weekly spelling quiz.

Please return this book every Monday in their book bag so they can complete their next spelling quiz.

Do not worry if your child is struggling with spellings at this time of year.

Curriculum

- As we have mixed-age classes, our curriculum is based around a two year topic cycle – Cycle A and Cycle B. Each subject has a Long Term Plan
- Knowledge Organisers
- Our Knowledge Organisers are used to support learning. They are stuck in the children's books and make it clear what is expected to be learned by the end of the topic.
- Review and Do
- Every topic starts with a review and do question to determine what the children already know
- End of Topic Quizzes' and the use of 'Big Questions'. Children showcase their learning at the end of each topic.

Mammal – an animal with fur or hair on its body.

Fur - the fine, soft hair found on different animals.

Bird – an animal with feathers, wings and a beak.

Feathers – the soft covering on the outside of hirds.

Beak – a bird's mouth and nose heak.

Insect – an animal with six legs.

Wing - a part of a hird's hody which some use to fly.

Fish – an animal with fins, gills and scales that lives in water.

Scales – small, hard layers that grow from the skin scales.

Gills – the part of the body that fish use to breathe.

Fin – a thin part that sticks out from the fish to help it swim and stay balanced.

Amphibian - an animal that can live on land and in water.

Webbed feet - feet with toes that are joined together to help with swimming.

Tond – an amphibian with dru, bumpu skin.

Newt - an amphibian with a long tail.

Reptile – an animal with dry scales on its body.

- To know that fish have the same needs for survival as hirds and mammals
- To identify the needs for survival of amphibians and reptiles and compare these to other animal groups
- To identify humans' needs for survival and explore the similarities and differences between humans and other animal groups.

Phonics

The Phonics Screening Check is designed to allow schools to assess whether children have made expected progress within their phonics learning and have reached an appropriate standard. It can help teachers to identify gaps in children's phonics knowledge and gives the school a picture of where children may be excelling or requiring extra support.

There will be a Year 1 Phonics Screening Meeting later in the Year to explain more information.
