Howard Carter

- Born in 1874 in Norfolk, England
- Discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun with Lord Carnarvon in 1922

Key Vocabulary:

Archaeology	The study of the graves, buildings, tools and other objects and cultures of ancient people.
Canopic Jar	Special jars that held the organs of a mummy
Hieroglyphics	a type of writing using pictures and symbols.
Papyrus	a plant from the banks of the Nile used to make paper, boats, sandals, baskets and rope.
Pharaoh	the supreme ruler of all of Ancient Egypt who was considered a god
Pyramids	Monuments providing tombs for pharaohs.
Mummy/ mummification	a dead body that has been preserved/the process of making a mummy.
River Nile	A river, which flows through the continent of Africa. It is the longest river throughout the world.
Sarcophagus	a large stone coffin for a mummy
