INTERNET SAFETY DAY – 10TH FEB 2026

As part of **Internet Safety Day**, we are reminding our school community of the importance of helping children stay safe, respectful, and confident online. The day encourages positive and responsible use of the internet and digital devices, both at school and at home. Families can support this by talking regularly with children about what they do online, setting clear boundaries around screen time and appropriate content, using privacy and parental controls where possible, and reminding children never to share personal information or passwords. Encouraging children to speak up if something online makes them feel uncomfortable, and modelling kind, respectful online behaviour, helps reinforce the message that staying safe online is a shared responsibility.
